

TIME

Everything revolves around time.

Time is relative, fast for some and slow for others.

Time is your friend, don't let it be your enemy.

Everybody has same amount of time, so "I don't have the time is incorrect". You mean "I don't want to take the time."

PreGame Time

- Be on Time
 - Plan your travel plans ahead of time
 - Leave on time
- Give the Assignor time
 - Don't wait until game time to call about your partner not there
 - If you can't leave on time, call the assignor to give him time for options
- Don't waste Assignor's time
 - Print out your schedule so you have phone numbers.
 - Learn how to get to site before travel time begins.
- If you know you will be late, take the time to call your partner.
 - Partner, keep your cell handed so he or you can call and not waste time
 - If late give honest estimate of time of arrival
- Accept or decline on time
 - If you don't then don't complain all the time about not getting games

Game Time

- Take the time to do a good pregame, walk through, inspection.
- Time to get on game face, quite goofing off.
- Use some time to warm up
- Start the game on time
- Keep the time.
- Stop time at appropriate times
- Show you are stopping time
- Show you are starting time
- Take time to communicate on cards, fouls and other strange things.
- Don't waste time
- Calm things down by slowing time, ie you look relaxed and confident.
- Half is 40 minutes, half time is 10 minutes.
- Make judgment calls on time. Not too soon and not too late.
- Use whistle every time after a sub.
- Have a good time or at least look like you are.

Keeper time

- Get there on time to see challenges with keeper
- Don't let keeper get bumped time and time again
- Keeper only gets 6 seconds, don't let him waste time
- Give keeper time to recover if he gets bumped fairly.
- Tell keeper to hold the ball while you take time to check on an injury. If not restart with indirect.
- Even if keeper has control of ball a split second that is time enough to have possession.

Your Time

- Take a break from soccer for a short period of time
- Have some fun time to refresh you desire
- Don't waste your time, stay in shape
- Use your time wisely, let you body heal.
- Remember, every two to threes years you will feel like your time has come to quit. Forget this and re-register. You'll be glad you took the time.
- Manage your time wisely: Family, Job, SOCCER.
- Spend some of your time being loyal to the SSOA. Scrimmages, jamborees, girls state championship, banquet, etc.

Big Time

How do you reach the top level games

- Know the rules.
- Know the mechanics and show them every time on every game.
- Score high on the test every time
- Learn all the time
 - Includes the USSF beginner class, advance class, and these meetings
 - Talk to and watch how other referees do things.
- Practice all the time what you learn
- Put in the time away from HS soccer (USSF games and tournaments)
- Put in the time getting assessed. Don't rush it, ask questions. The observer has lots of time to figure it out versus your split second.
- Take time to sell your calls. This you have to figure out.
- Scarifice your time
- Opportunity does not come along all the time
- Be patient, your time will come (but not too patient)

Best Time

The best referees do this:

- Are able to slow time to see things clearly
- Judge offside and time it right on when to raise the flag
- Able to watch challenge even when ball is away and turn at right time to pick up play without missing late challenges
- On time
- Take the time to do the necessary things every game
- Give the time to being prepared
- Get's to injuries in quick time
- Issues card or talks to player at the right time
- Get there at the right time
- Follow ball to end line every time
